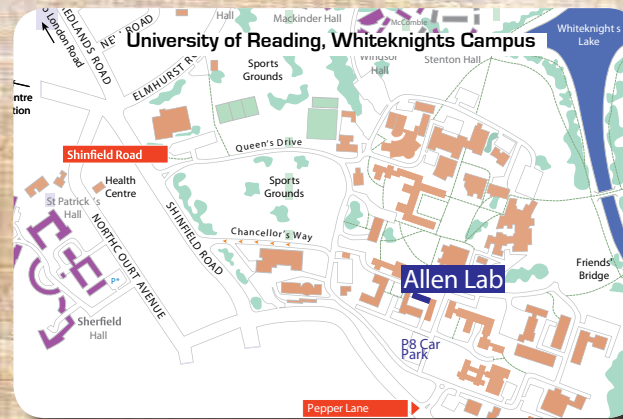

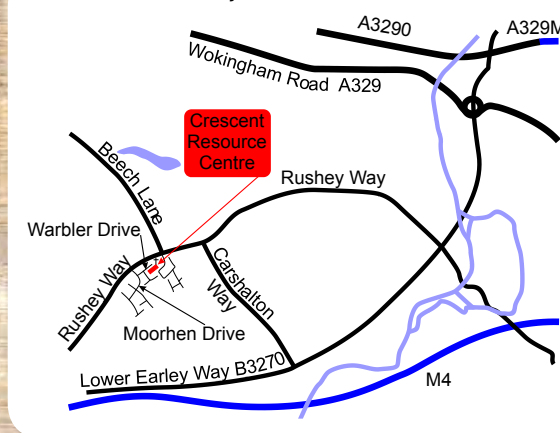

The Body in Ancient Egypt

Saturday 27 October 2012, 10.00 - 4.30 **Cost:** £20.00

The study of the human body is endlessly fascinating. In this study day we shall examine the human body in Ancient Egypt: the ideal body as it was portrayed in the art and literature of Ancient Egypt, and how much that differed from the actual body in terms of evidence for illness, injury and abnormality. This will lead us to consider how the ancient

Egyptians went about healing the body of a variety of diseases and injuries. For this we will examine sources such as human remains and medical papyri. We will go on to explore feeding and clothing the body. We shall examine the diet of both the poor and the rich and will discuss any foods that might have been considered taboo. As well as examining the clothes worn by the ancient Egyptians we shall explore other ways in which they chose to adorn their bodies, including wigs, jewellery and tattoos.

British Museum excavations at Amara West in northern Sudan are shedding light on interactions between Egyptians and Nubians, painting a very different picture from that of the bombastic royal inscriptions and temple scenes. Archaeologists and scientists from the project will present the latest findings from the ancient town, once the Ramesside capital of Upper Nubia, and its cemeteries.



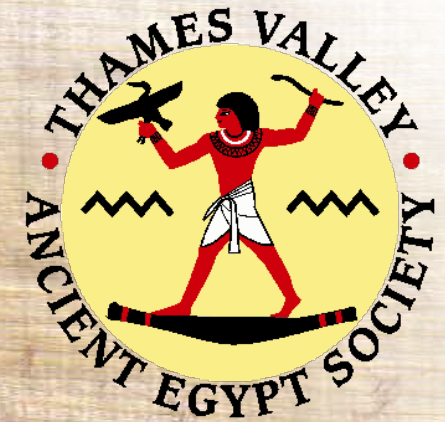
