Gateway to an artistic renaissance - South Asasif Conservation Project in context

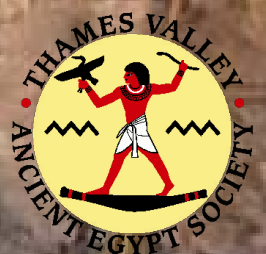
